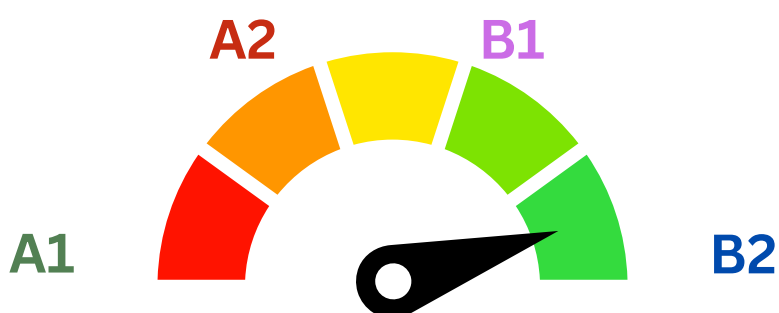

What Is The TEF Canada Accelerate Program?

The TEF Canada accelerate program is an e-course designed for those who want to learn French from beginner level to intermediary level in the quickest time possible.



Understanding The CEFR

The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages: Learning, Teaching, Assessment, abbreviated in English as CEFR, CEF, or CEFRL, is a guideline used to describe achievements of learners of foreign languages across Europe and, increasingly, in other countries.

The CEFR is also intended to make it easier for educational institutions and employers to evaluate the language qualifications of candidates for education admission or employment. Its main aim is to provide a method of learning, teaching, and assessing that applies to all languages in Europe.

The Common European Framework divides learners into three broad divisions that can each be further divided into two levels; for each level, it describes what a learner is supposed to be able to do in reading, listening, speaking and writing. The following table indicates these levels

B Independent User	B1 Threshold	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure, etc. • Can deal with most situations likely to arise while travelling in an area where the language is spoken. • Can produce simple connected text on topics that are familiar or of personal interest. • Can describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.
	B2 Vantage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can understand the main ideas of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics, including technical discussions in their field of specialisation.

E- Course

The classes are divided into 4 levels A1, A2, B1 & B2. Each level has 20-25 recorded classes covering carefully selected topics, a quiz section after each class, a link to learning resources and an option to request for a one on one session with a tutor if more explanation is needed. Pop-up group classes are also organised (free of charge) to enable learners interact and practice with other learners and ask questions.

Course set-up

1. First, you have your class video. Watch and respond when you are asked questions. The classes are made to be interactive.
2. At the end of each class, you have to take a quiz based on the lesson taught in class.
3. We have included educative learning resources for you at the end of each class to help reinforce the topic taught. They could come in form of videos, podcasts or pdf documents.
4. Regular reminders would be sent for classes
5. You can request for tutor support if at anytime you do not understand or need clarity on a particular lesson. This would give you access to a one-on-one with a tutor.
6. Look out for pop-up group classes. This gives you an opportunity to exchange with a tutor as well as other learners. This is free.
7. A level is scheduled to run for 12 weeks. This means in those 12 weeks, you can take the class any day and time you like. However, after 12 weeks, access will be closed and you would have to re-register if you hadn't finished the lessons.

There's always a space for feedback (Questionnaire) at the end of each class so don't forget to give us a feedback. Could be a thumbs up if you enjoyed the class or liked your teacher or even a sad smiley if you didn't like something in the class. We would be expecting your feedback.

Fee

Each level which consists of 30-35 class lessons is charged at N20,000 (payment is made directly on the website). Once payment is made, you gain access to the level for a period of 12 weeks.

Tutor Support

You can request for tutor support if at anytime you do not understand or need clarity on a particular lesson. This would give you access to a one-on-one private class with a tutor. This service is charged at N10,000 per hour.

Group Class

Pop-up group classes are also organised (free of charge) to enable learners interact and practice with other learners and ask questions.

Learning Materials

To enroll for the acceleration course, some learning materials are highly recommended, although not compulsory. The link to purchase them is shared upon registration.

Evaluation

At the end of each lesson there is a class quiz and at the completion of a level, there is an optional evaluation exam which can be taken. Upon successful completion of the exam, a certificate will be given. This is a paid service.

Preparatory Class

Upon completion of the program A1-B2, a TEF preparatory class is organised to test your language skills and treat past questions focusing on the 4 language learning competencies; reading, writing, listening & speaking. This service is optional and is charged at N80,000 for 12 hours. This can be done at your convenience.

FAQs TEF Canada Acceleration Program

➤ How long will it take to finish a level?

The program is set to run at your pace and time. Each level is however open for only 12 weeks. This means you can be done with a level in as short as 2-3 weeks or as long as 3 months.

➤ Will I be fluent at the end of the program?

The lessons are available to be listened to over and over again. An option for tutor support as well as pop up group classes are available. However, a strict personal study and practice is strongly advised.

➤ Is this course enough to prepare me for the TEF exam?

The TEF exam tests your level in the 4 competencies which are reading, writing, listening and speaking. The course is designed to train you on these aspects although at varying degrees. Pop up group classes and forum serve to build communication skills (speaking & writing). A special TEF preparatory class is organised at the end of the program.

➤ Can I take this course even though I don't want to write the TEF exam?

Yes you can. The classes are designed for those who want to learn and communicate in French language.

➤ Can I get a private Tutorial after the lessons?

Yes you can. You can either request for tutor support or register for an intensive or semi-intensive class private class.

➤ Can you help me register for TEF?

No. The program only covers classes and preparations for the exam.

FAQs TEF Canada

➤ What is TEF Canada?

The TEF (test d'évaluation de français) is an international benchmark test. It measures your level of knowledge and skills in French.

➤ What does the test consist of?

The TEF Canada consists of 4 modules to evaluate your level of proficiency in oral and written skills: Oral comprehension: 40 min – 40 questions. Written comprehension: 60 min – 40 questions. Oral expression: 15 min – 2 subjects to be covered.

Things To Note

The written comprehension, oral comprehension and written expression will be computer-based only.

No prior qualification is required to sit the exam. Candidates must be at least 16 years of age. Candidates may take the test several times, allowing a minimum of 30 days between two exam sessions.

The objective of the TEF is to evaluate your French skills on a scale with 7 levels, from level 0 (most basic skills) to level 6 (complete fluency). This scale corresponds to:

- the 6 competency levels, A1 to C2, of the Council of Europe's Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).
